Initiative and Referendum

The initiative and referendum process is a system of direct government by the people. An initiative allows citizens to directly propose a law or a constitutional amendment to be voted upon by the electorate.

A referendum allows voters to accept or reject a law or constitutional amendment passed or proposed by the State Legislature. The Legislature must refer measures to the people in the case of constitutional amendments, tax levies and bond issues. In other cases, the Legislature may refer legislation. In addition, citizens may file referendum petitions.

In order to start an initiative, you must file the appropriate paperwork to begin the process. The supporters then must obtain signatures from registered voters. The number of signatures needed is a fixed percentage based on votes cast for Governor in the preceding election.

Registering to Vote

- You must be a resident of Oregon
- You must be a US Citizen
- You must be 17 years of age – no ballot will be sent until an election occurs on or after your 18th birthday
- Deadline to register is 21 days before an election
- Registration is permanent unless you make any changes. Changes include name, home address, mailing address or political party
- May **register online:** www.oregonvotes.org Click on the “Register now” button.
- **Mail in registration** form (must be postmarked by deadline). Forms may be found at elections offices, post offices, Department of Motor Vehicles offices, on the web or in phone directories
- **Register in person** at County Elections Office

Vote by Mail

In 1998, Oregon voters passed an initiative petition making all elections vote-by-mail.

A ballot is mailed to each registered voter approximately three weeks before the election. A registered voter who does not receive a ballot may request another.

After marking the ballot, the voter may (1) return it by mail; (2) deliver it to any official drop site in Oregon; or (3) deliver it in person to any elections office in Oregon. Ballots must be received by 8:00 pm on Election Day to be counted.

Elections in Oregon

There are two regularly scheduled statewide elections in even-numbered years: the Primary Election in May and the General Election in November.

- Primary elections may consist of partisan and nonpartisan positions and, possibly, measures on the ballot.
- Major party candidates contend for partisan positions in the primary. Only voters affiliated with a party may vote for candidates of that party. An exception to this would be if the party chooses to open the primary to independent voters.
- Other registered voters vote only for nonpartisan candidates and ballot measures.
- Nonpartisan candidates may win outright in the primary based on a specified percentage of the vote. If that percentage is not achieved by one candidate, the two candidates with the most votes will contend in the general election.

The legislature may choose to call a special election at any time.

District elections are held at various times of the year. Only voters whose residence is in a given district are eligible to vote in the district election.

Multnomah County Circuit Court is the trial court for Multnomah County. Oregon's circuit courts are a division of the Oregon Judicial Department, the third branch of Oregon's state government.

In the early 1980's, the Legislative Assembly joined the previously county-funded circuit courts into a unified state-funded court system, and placed it under the authority of the Oregon Judicial Department. (Other courts included in the Oregon Judicial Department are the Oregon Tax Court, the Oregon Court of Appeals, and the Oregon Supreme Court. Oregon has three types of locally-funded courts that are not part of the Oregon Judicial Department: county courts, justice courts, and municipal courts.) Each county continues to bear responsibility for providing and maintaining courthouse facilities for the circuit court within its boundaries.

The circuit courts of Oregon's state court system are divided into 27 judicial districts. The 4th judicial district, covering Multnomah County, has the most judges of Oregon's 27 judicial districts (38). The court is also served by 12.5 referee positions. Some referees sit, by appointment from the Oregon Supreme Court, as judges pro tempore of the circuit court. The circuit court is also supported by senior judges and several members of the local bar who serve as volunteer judges pro tempore.

All circuit judges are elected by the voters within their judicial district, in nonpartisan elections, for six-year terms. The Governor may appoint a qualified person to fill mid-term vacancies. An appointee who wishes to remain a judge must be elected to a full term at the next general election. The Chief Justice of the Supreme Court appoints a presiding judge for each district and also may appoint interim judges.

The circuit court is a trial court of "general jurisdiction," including both criminal and civil matters, but excluding tax cases (tax cases are heard by the Oregon Tax Court). Criminal cases include felonies, misdemeanors, or violations of state and local laws by adults and juveniles. Civil cases include all matters that are not criminal. Examples of civil cases are small claims, family and contract disputes, personal injury cases, landlord-tenant disputes, and probate issues.

By statute (ORS 3.136), the Multnomah County Circuit Court is the municipal court for the City of Portland and serves as the municipal court for the City of Gresham and other municipal governments in Multnomah County, with the exceptions of the City of Troutdale and the City of Fairview. Municipal courts have concurrent jurisdiction with circuit courts over all violations and misdemeanors (e.g., traffic violations; violations of municipal codes and ordinances; and certain minor tobacco, liquor, and drug violations). Municipal courts do not have jurisdiction over felonies.

Criminal and Civil Judges

The judges assigned to Criminal and Civil Court hear all criminal cases (misdemeanors and felonies), as well as infractions and traffic violations. They also hear civil cases.

Family and Juvenile Judges

The judges assigned to Family Court hear all domestic relations (divorce and child custody) cases, juvenile court matters (dependency, delinquency, and termination of parental rights), as well as probate, and civil commitment cases. The Family Court judges also hear misdemeanor criminal cases scheduled in Domestic Violence Court.

Criminal and Civil Referees

The referees are judicial officers who serve as pro tempore (Latin for "for the time being" or temporary) circuit court judges under appointment from the Oregon Supreme Court. During their appointments they have the same authority as any other circuit judge. They are employees of the Oregon Judicial Department as Referees. The referees usually sit in the following courts: small claims; landlord and tenant; civil commitments; traffic arraignments and trials; and the Justice

State Legislature

The Oregon Legislative Assembly convenes annually in February at the State Capitol in Salem, but sessions may not exceed 160 days in odd-numbered years and 35 days in even-numbered years. The Senate and the House of Representatives compose the Assembly. The Senate includes 30 members elected for four-year terms. The House has 60 representatives serving two-year terms. The principle role of the Legislature is to enact laws and finance state government.
