

## Historical Tour of Multnomah County

Here's your opportunity to learn about the scandals and scuttlebutt behind some of Multnomah County's historical sites and buildings.

On Wednesday, October 3, from 10 am to 4 pm, Jewel Lansing and Fred Leeson, authors of the just-published *Multnomah: The Tumultuous Story of Oregon's Most Populous County*, will lead us on a bus tour through the county's dramatic past.

We'll meet near Lloyd Center and start at 10 am sharp by traveling Highway 30 to see where the Lewis and Clark Exposition was and now where much industry dominates the landscape; we'll cross the graceful St. Johns Bridge to view the domed National Cash Register Building moved from its original 1905 World's Fair site. We'll cross to Marine Drive, learn about the Vanport flood and the Japanese Internment Camp at the Expo Center and then go on to the controversial Wapato Jail. We will venture east to Gresham to visit some of the county's newer buildings and then on to the many wonders of the Columbia River Gorge.


