
Bios for 2020-21 Nominees to the LWVPDX Board and Nominating Committee

I moved to Portland last summer after retiring as a professor of Anthropology at the University of California, Santa Cruz. My wife and I were drawn here by our daughter and her family and by our strong sense of Portland as a lively and engaged community in a very beautiful part of the world.

We were League members throughout our time in Claremont and Palo Alto, but my personal organizational energies were focused primarily on university and professional communities. I am a social and linguistic anthropologist, trained at Stanford and Harvard, with field research experience ranging from Fiji to federal science bureaucracies in Washington, DC. At the heart of my research has been an interest in the relationship between language and politics and a core concern with the question of how talk and other forms of communication

make a difference in shaping and transforming communities. I've written on topics from children's arguments and men's gossip to the style and dynamics of research funding panel meetings. I taught for forty-five years, first at Pitzer College in Claremont, CA, and then at UCSC, where I was active in shared governance and served as Chair of the Academic Senate. I have been very involved in academic organizations, serving as President of the American Anthropological Association and editing several scholarly journals.

All the organizational participation has led to my becoming familiar with the work of budget, finance, and audit committees. I'm looking forward to learning more about and contributing more actively to the work of the League here in Portland.
